⁶ Do not link to individual reports- instead, link to appropriate subject heading.

⁷ Provide link to appropriate sections of bibliography.

⁸ The agency name should be linked to the agency homepage with the agency name spelled out, followed by the acronym. Use only the acronym for subsequent entries. Agencies should be in alphabetical order with sub-pages within the agency tabbed one or two tabs, depending on your format. **NO MORE THAN TWO TABS! ERS publications should be listed in reverse chronological order.**

⁹ These should be labeled with the name of the page itself, with the link pasted beneath the title.

¹⁰ This section is a catch-all for federal sites with only one or two sites per agency. Use your discretion in determining whether the agency should get a heading of its own or go into the catch-all section

¹¹ This is the section for non-federal government websites. Examples include industry/watchdog sites, state gov sites, extension information, international resources, and many others

¹² Use these abbreviations as examples.

¹³ All publications should include the source and date of publication whenever possible

¹⁴ If there are other publications NOT IN THE BIBLIOGRAPHY that you feel are important to include, add this section.
