Biofuels Statutory Citations

STATE OF ALABAMA

This compilation of state statutory citations focuses predominantly on biofuels laws in effect January 1, 1970 through December 31, 2013. It is intended to serve as a researcher-friendly inventory of state laws by providing the formal title of relevant legislation, the standard legal citation for each statute, the applicability of the statute (ethanol, biodiesel, or both), and a brief description of the law. Some statutes and regulations listed do not specifically relate to biofuels, but are included because of their complementary relationship to the evolution of biofuels law in the state.

Biofuel Production Facility Tax Credit (2015)	ALA. CODE §§ 40-18-190 TO 40-18-203 (REPEALED JULY 2, 2015)	Both	Provided an income tax credit up to 5% of the costs for 20 years for development of a biofuel production facility.
Center for Alternative Fuels (2007)	ALA. CODE §§ 2-2-90 TO 2-2-93	Both	Established the Center for Alternative Fuels (Center) within the Alabama Department of Agriculture and Industries to promote alternative fuels as a viable energy source in the state. The Center assesses the status and development of alternative fuels sources, ensures that all alternative fuels sold in the state meets current ASTM standards, and acts as an informational outlet for alternative fuels and a clearinghouse for federal grant funding for alternative fuel development. The Center also administers a grant program funded by an income tax check-off program through the Alabama Alternative Fuels and Research Development Fund.
Public Interest Energy and Fuel Research and Development Grants Fund (1975)	ALA. CODE §§ 2-2-110 TO 2-2-114	Both	Created a fund to help develop technologies to enhance the state's portfolio of energy and fuel sources. The fund is implemented and administered through the Center for Alternative Fuels, within the state Department of Agriculture and Industries.
