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## Biofuels Statutory Citations

### STATE OF VERMONT

*This compilation of state statutory citations focuses predominantly on biofuels laws in effect January 1, 1970 through December 31, 2013. It is intended to serve as a researcher-friendly inventory of state laws by providing the formal title of relevant legislation, the standard legal citation for each statute, the applicability of the statute (ethanol, biodiesel, or both), and a brief description of the law. Some statutes listed do not specifically relate to biofuels, but are included because of their complementary relationship to the evolution of biofuels law in the state. These statutes are placed in reverse chronological order using the date of the most recent amendment to the statute. Many biofuels laws were enacted as amendments to previously passed laws.*

Farm Viability Enhancement Program (2015)	<a href="#">VT. STAT. ANN. TIT. 6, § 4710</a>	Both	Provides technical and financial assistance for the development of businesses that harvest biomass, convert biomass to energy, or produce biofuels.
Employment Growth Incentive (2013)	<a href="#">VT. STAT. ANN. TIT. 32, § 5930b</a>	Both	Provided income tax credit for businesses involved in the design, development, or manufacture of clean energy, including biomass fuels, as an incentive to increase their workforce and capital investments.
Clean Energy Development Fund (2013)	<a href="#">VT. STAT. ANN. TIT. 30, § 8015</a>	Both	Provides grants for clean energy development, which includes biofuel projects.
Requisition for supplies and materials (2013)	<a href="#">VT. STAT. ANN. TIT. 29, § 903</a>	Both	When purchasing State vehicles the Commissioner shall consider those using alternative fuels when the fuel is suitable for the vehicle, is available in the region, and is competitively priced.
Findings; intent-Hemp (2013)	<a href="#">VT. STAT. ANN. TIT. 6, § 561</a>	Both	Declares a state finding that hemp is an acceptable and available resource from which biofuel can be produced. State intends to establish policy to allow farmers and business to take advantage of hemp.

Heating oil content; biodiesel (2011)	<a href="#">VT. STAT. ANN. TIT. 10, § 585</a>	Biodiesel	Unless waived by an executive order, all heating oil sold in the state must contain at least 3% biodiesel by July 1, 2012, 5% by 2015, and 7% by 2016.
High-Tech Growth Incentives (2005)	<a href="#">VT. STAT. ANN. TIT. 32, § 5930k</a>	Both	Provided income tax credit for businesses involved in the design, development, and manufacture of alternative fuel vehicles. No new credits will be issued after Jan. 1, 2007, and the section is repealed in 2017.
