## Biofuels Statutory Citations

### STATE OF WEST VIRGINIA

*This compilation of state statutory citations focuses predominantly on biofuels laws in effect January 1, 1970 through December 31, 2013. This compilation is intended to serve as a researcher-friendly inventory of state laws by providing the formal title of relevant legislation, the standard legal citation for each statute and a brief description of the law. These statutes are placed in reverse chronological order using the date of the most recent amendment to the statute. Many biofuels laws were enacted as amendments to previously passed laws.*

Alternative-Fuel Motor Vehicles Tax Credit (2013)	<a href="#">W. VA. CODE §§ 11-6D-1 TO 11-6D-9</a>	Ethanol	Provides a tax credit for purchasing or converting to an alternative fuel vehicle and/or installing corresponding refueling infrastructure, includes ethanol until April 15, 2013.
Purpose, Director of Energy Development (2010)	<a href="#">W. VA. CODE § 5B-2F-2</a>	Ethanol	Created the Division of Energy to oversee the state energy policy and coordinate renewable energy projects, including biofuels, across the state.
Use of Alternative Fuels in State-Owned Vehicles (1999)	<a href="#">W. VA. CODE §§ 5A-2A-1 TO 5A-2A-2</a>	Ethanol	Requires at least 75% of vehicles purchased by the state must run on alternative fuels, which includes ethanol, subject to economic and availability constraints.
Prohibition of subsidies or incentive payments (1993)	<a href="#">W. VA. CODE §§ 5A-2A-4, 8-27A-3,</a>	Ethanol	Prohibits the state and political subdivisions from providing subsidies or other incentive payments for the production of ethanol.
Posting of alcoholic content of gasoline (1990)	<a href="#">W. VA. CODE § 47-10-6a</a>	Ethanol	Requires retailers to label retail pumps that dispense gasoline mixed with ethanol, as well as the level of alcohol content.
